

## **Clear Creek County Sportsmen Club: Information & Procedures – 2020**

### **Please read this information!**

**Membership:** The base membership is \$80 / year. Out-of-County law officer fees are \$50; officers based or living in the county are given a free membership. Memberships are individual; not family memberships and are only for the calendar year. Members have guest and family privileges, but guests or family cannot be on the range without the member and they must stay alongside the member at all times. Members and guests may use only one bay at a time. Membership cards and gate codes are not to be given to anyone else. Members use of a rifle bay supersedes that of any guests. Guests are subject to all procedures and rules of the club. Children and pets have to be under adult supervision. Guests and children must have eye and ear protection or remain in their vehicle or well behind the firing line to avoid injuries.

**Renewal of Membership:** January and February are the renewal grace period for previous year members. Members not renewed before March 1 will have to re-apply and wait to join the club. Members without access to the club website will be mailed the forms. Gate codes change each March 1.

- 1) The next years dues will earn credits toward membership at the rate of \$10 / hour up to a maximum of 8 hours for civilian membership and 5 hours for law officers. Credits can be earned by working on the range, for the club or helping with events. The renewal Application form has a section for calculating the annual fee.
- 2) Members are required to have and wear their card in plain sight while on the range to prove they aren't trespassers. Any member that does not have their card with them is to leave the range immediately. Police ID is accepted from Clear Creek County deputies, CSP and other officers based in the county.

**Arrangement:** The range is leased from Clear Creek County until each January 1. Keep in mind that your behavior has a direct effect in maintaining good relations with the county and continuing our lease. The range is 4.24 acres in area. We have five short range bays (# 1,2,3,4 and 7) each about 25 – 30 yards deep, and two bays (#5 & 6) with shooting houses on ranges 100 yards long. Bay 4 has a target shed with targets for members use.

- 1) When you enter or leave the range, lock the gates. **KEEP THE GATES LOCKED AT ALL TIMES** except when there is an event allowing non-members and a club officer or event official is present.
- 2) All shooting in Bay 5 is to be done from inside the house, unless special permission is arranged with the Executive Officer to shoot in front of the house. All shooting from Bay 6 is to be done from inside the shed or the outside bench line, but not from any other position.
- 3) The range is open to general members use except when the range or a portion of the range is closed for special events such as IPSC, IDPA, Trap shoots, etc. A Rodeo arena is next to the west side of the range at the west gate. Please avoid shooting next to the livestock pens next to Bay 1.
- 4) Pick up your trash, remove all targets from the backers and pick up your brass. Please use the trash barrels and if they're full take your trash home. **Do not burn trash or start any fires on the range.**
- 5) Law officers may train here on weekdays and will not interfere with your shooting unless absolutely necessary. Their formal training is usually scheduled, but if law officers give us short notice they want a range reservation we may not have time to get it posted on the club calendar. If law officers show up to use a bay you are in please cooperate with them and surrender the bay to them.
- 6) There is a phone in the shooting house in Bay 6.

**Meetings:** General membership meetings are usually held on the second Tuesday of May and September at 7:00 pm. Directions & location will be given in mailed announcement and in the club web site. Board of Director's meetings will be held, usually, on the second Tuesday of April, August and November. Members are welcome at board meetings but will not have voting rights on issues decided by the board.

**Trespassers:** Occasionally, non-members enter the range without permission. They usually enter to get information about using the range or joining the club. Give them the info that you can and then ask them to leave. Don't use force or abusive language or put yourself at risk. If they won't leave, you should leave and then call the Sheriff's Office at 911.
